From the August Board Meeting......

There were 5 Board Members and 2 Lions Members present at the *August 12th* meeting held at the North Carroll Senior and Community Center in Greenmount.

Treasurer Andy reported that the club has made donations to the Lions Saving Kids Sight Foundation and to the Lineboro VFD.

Lion Joe reports that the pool is doing well but the weather and the economy have things down a little from last year. There is a need to replace two valves this coming year. Lion Larry is getting prices.

President Charlie mentioned that everything went well with the Special Olympic Swim Party on *August 9th*. CCSO donated the hot dogs and the club supplied everything else.

There was discussion regarding the new fence that was installed at the pool. The Town Zoning Board says we are in violation. The letter was read and Lion Wayne drafted an appeal letter with a request for a variance. All members present voted to approve and submit the letter to the Manchester Zoning Board.

Lion Larry brought in a grant application for Wal-Mart. Members voted to ask for money to purchase a difibulator for the community pool.

Lion Carl volunteered to chair this year's Charter Night Committee.

It was mentioned that Manchester Valley High School will be having a Maverick Stampede on *September 2nd* and are looking for volunteers. The Board decided that, since this was a meeting night anyway, we would have a short meeting at the pool at 6:00 PM and then help out at the Carnival Grounds starting at 7:00 PM. Lion Carol volunteered to chair the activity.

The *August 19th* meeting was held at the Lineboro Fireman's Hall in Lineboro. There were 17 club members present. The guest speaker for the evening was our very own Lion Larry Burbank who gave an informative presentation on Vehicle Safety.

Secretary Steve read several thank-you letters received by the club. Two were for hosting the Special Olympics Swim Party and summer campers at the pool. The others were for our recent donations to the Lions Saving Kids Foundation and the Leader Dogs for the Blind Program.

Lion Joe reported that the pool is winding down for the summer and there are several things that will need to be done to winterize it and he will let us know what needs to be done. He also mentioned that Lion Larry was able to save us a considerable amount of money on the purchase of 2 new valves for the pool. These valves have never been replaced since the pool opened over 50 years ago. Lion Joe also mentioned that the Special Olympics Swim Party held August 9th was a great success. He thanked everyone that helped make it such a rewarding experience.

Lion Joe mentioned that everything is set for the Crab Feast on *September 26th*. We still need to sell more tickets. He will have a work sign-up sheet at the next meeting.

Lion Andy mentioned that all the ads have been sold for the Birthday Calendar. He still needs to collect some of the money yet.

Lion Steve mentioned that we have enough people to man the pubs at the Renaissance Festival on *September* 7^{th} . We only have a few people signed up to help with the sodas on *September* 12^{th} . Lions Fran and Joe Bach said they will be able to supply 12 more folks to help. That still leaves us a few more folks to go.

Secretary Steve mentioned that there are still 6 members that have not paid their dues for this coming year yet. It was suggested that a reminder be sent out in September.

Lions Wayne and Larry discussed the situation with the Town regarding the newly installed fencing the club put up at the pool. It seems we are in violation of a town code regarding the use of a cable. Lion Wayne suggested we contact the Town Zoning Board and ask for a variance. The board has a meeting on *September 15th* that he and Lion Steve will attend. Lion Larry will recluse himself since he is on the Zoning Board and a Lions member.

Lion Cindy mentioned that she has "Debz Stylz" in Manchester collecting aluminum cans for the club. She suggested members might want to ask other businesses in the community to do the same.

President Charlie reminded everyone that the *September 16th* meeting will be District Governor Bob Disinger's official club visit. Everyone is encouraged to attend and wear their blue club shirts.
