The *September 2nd* meeting was held at the Club's Community Swimming Pool in Manchester. At the meeting, several of the club's upcoming activities were discussed and finalized. Lion Larry reported that there were over 200 pool members at the Appreciation Party held on Sunday August 30th and everyone seemed to have a great time.

Lion George reported that we made \$52 for the aluminum cans he just turned in.

The Meeting was officially adjourned at 6:20 PM. Members then joined the festivities at the Manchester Firemen's Activity Building for the 1st Annual Manchester Valley High School Stampede, where several members joined the walk to the new High School for the introduction of the school's sports teams.

There were 10 Board Members and 1 Lions Member present at the *September 9th* meeting held at the North Carroll Senior and Community Center in Greenmount.

Lion Joe reported that we had some minor vandalism to the concession stand just before we closed for the season. The break-in was reported to the police. Lion Joe also thanked Lion Larry for getting us the two new valves for the pool and for saving the club a substantial amount of money.

Lion Steve reported that the Labor Day Renaissance Festival fund raiser was a success. Members donated \$390 in tips back to the club. This with the wages earned should net the club approximately \$1200.

There was discussion regarding the new fence that was installed at the pool and the Manchester Town Zoning Board meeting on September 15th. Lions Charlie, Wayne, Andy and Chuck said they would attend the meeting and ask for a variance.

Lion Andy reported that the flyers and invitations for this year's Charter Night have been printed and mailed. He reported that we will have the North Carroll Ensemble for entertainment again this year. PID Joe Gaffigan will be the guest speaker.

Lion Larry reported that the club will be touring the new MVHS on *October* 7^{th} , and we will have Mr. Elwin Wagner, President of the Manchester Volunteer Fire Department as our guest speaker at the *November* 4^{th} meeting. We will also have Manchester Police Chief Jerry Gall as our guest at the *December* 2^{nd} meeting.

Lion Carol reported that she has given the Peace Poster Contest information to NCMS and the she will be giving the recently received American Heritage Contest information to MVHS.

The board voted to have the club's Christmas Party *on December 9th*. Lion Larry will check on the availability of the Lineboro Fire Hall. Lion Fran has agreed to chair this year's party.

Lion Andy reported that he and Zone Chair Steve visited the Charles Carroll Lions Club on September 2nd and that he, President Charlie and Secretary Steve visited the Valley Lions Club for the Zone meeting on September 8th.

Lion Andy suggested a Diabetes Awareness program for a future meeting. He suggested Lion George Butler from the Valley Lions Club to present the program. Lion Larry will contact him for availability.

President Charlie reported that the Bull Roast date change is now a non-issue.

The *September 16th* meeting was held at the Lineboro Fireman's Hall in Lineboro. There were 19 club members and 7 guests present. This was District Governor Robert Disinger's official club visit. Lion Steve mentioned that we finally had enough people to man the pubs at the Renaissance Festival on September 7th and the soda booths on September 12th. He said he had his doubts right up to the last minute. He will have a full report when the checks from the Renaissance Festival come in.

Lion George turned in to the Treasurer, a \$150 donation and Lion Chuck turned in a \$200 donation, both from community residents for the use of the club's Hospital Equipment.

Lion Wayne mentioned that the request for a variance from the Manchester Town Zoning Board for the newly installed fencing the club put up at the pool was approved on September 15th. President Charlie reported that Lion Wayne represented us well. It is now referred to as a *Traffic Control Barrier*.
