The meeting was held at the Manchester Activites Building. There were 13 club members and one guest in attendance.

Mr. Dan Feustel gave a very interesting presentation on the *Literacy Council of Carroll County*.

After a brief history on the Council, he mentioned a couple success stories and presented several interesting facts regarding the number of people that need help, not only in the county but throughout Maryland and the nation. The Literacy Council offers free and confidential tutoring to children and adults from 4 to 60 years old no matter what their circumstances are. They develop or improve students' skills in speaking, reading, writing, math, English for speakers of other languages, and basic computer operation. There is no experience needed to become a tutor who must be at least 18 and have a high school diploma or equivalent. Tutors must attend a 14 hour training workshop and commit to 1-2 hours tutoring per week.
